1. How to get to Geisenheim

For your journey to Geisenheim, we recommend using **Frankfurt am Main** - a major international transport hub - as your main reference point when planning connections. From there, Geisenheim is accessible by regional transport.

Due to the Deutsche Bahn's "Right Rhine Corridor Renovation" project, the **railway line between Wiesbaden towards Geisenheim and Rüdesheim will be completely closed** during our WP meeting. When arriving over Frankfurt you can go by regional transport (S-Bahn or Regionalzug (RE10) to Wiesbaden. From there the replacement bus services bring you to Geisenheim, Rüdesheim or wherever you're staying. There will be several replacement buses that will serve Geisenheim and also Rüdesheim as destinations. The [replacement transport schedule](#) shows which buses will operate. Helpful would probably be to download the [Deutsche Bahn App](#) and/or the [RMVgo App](#) to see the schedules for regional transport and the replacement service.

Getting around locally

If your hotel is not in Geisenheim, there are several ways to travel to Hochschule Geisenheim University each day during our WP Meeting. One option is to use the replacement rail service that has already been described above.



Alternatively, you could rent a bicycle. If you are staying in one of the nearby towns, cycling is probably the fastest way to get to the university. Affordable bike rentals are available, for example from [Rheingau Riesling Rad](#) in Rüdesheim.

2. Consider traveling green

We would also like to encourage you to consider a sustainable way of travelling if possible. Choosing the train can **reduce CO₂ emissions by up to 96.5%** compared to taking the plane. To explore your personal impact, you can calculate how much CO₂ you can save by travelling sustainably on the [EcoPassenger](#) website.

3. Tips for green traveling & Ticket Booking

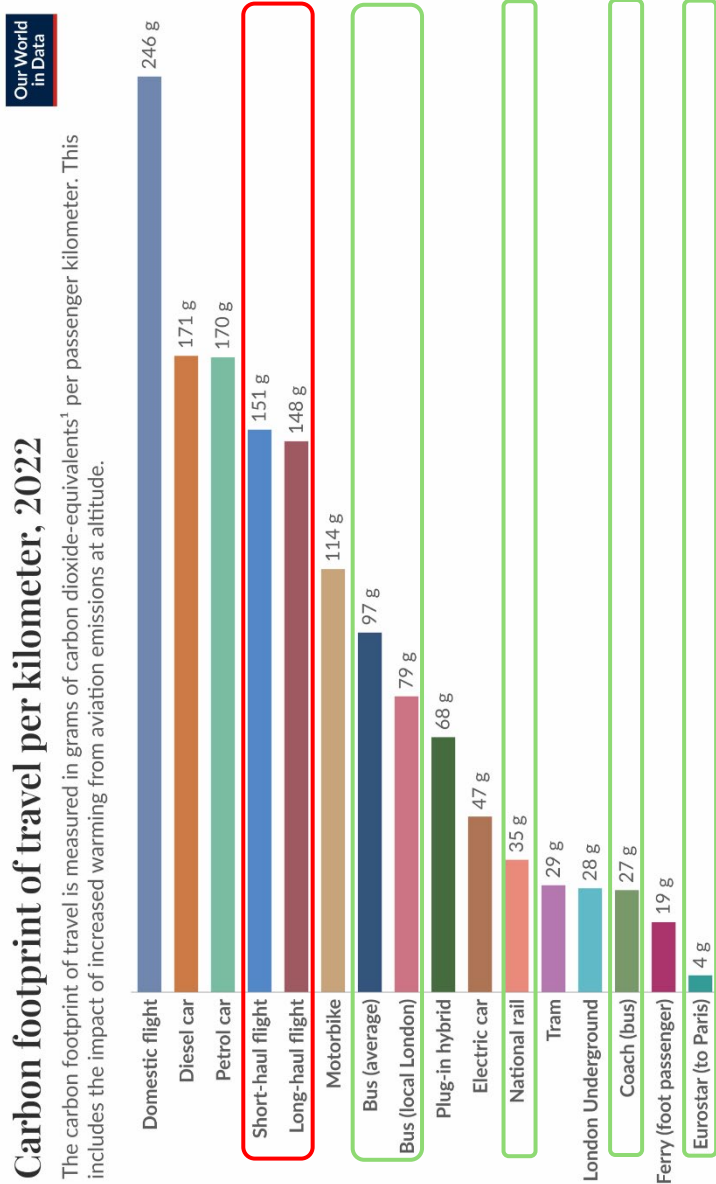
- **Compare different booking options.** There is no single best booking strategy. While booking your entire journey through one platform can be convenient, it is not always possible when travelling across several countries or using different transport operators. It is often worth comparing prices on different websites.
- **Option 1: Booking the whole journey through one website.** Websites such as [Trainline](#) and [RailEurope](#) can help you plan and, in many cases, book international journeys involving multiple operators.
- **Option 2: Booking directly with the railway operator.** to book tickets via the official railway websites (e.g. [DB Deutsche Bahn](#), [SNCF](#), [CP Comboios de Portugal](#), [Renfe](#), [Trenitalia](#), [CFR Călători](#), [MÁV](#), etc.). From experience if a train is delayed or cancelled and you miss a connecting train, railway companies generally offer an alternative connection, provided you can prove the delay or cancellation. This is a significant advantage compared to air travel, where separate flight bookings with different airlines may require purchasing a completely new ticket.
- **Allow sufficient transfer time.** When planning your journey, make sure to leave enough time between connections. This is especially important in cities such as Paris, where changing trains may require transferring between different railway stations.

- **Plan ahead for a smoother journey.** Booking tickets early not only often results in lower fares but also gives you more flexibility when choosing convenient and reliable connections.

Carbon footprint of travel per kilometer, 2022

The carbon footprint of travel is measured in grams of carbon dioxide-equivalents¹ per passenger kilometer. This includes the impact of increased warming from aviation emissions at altitude.



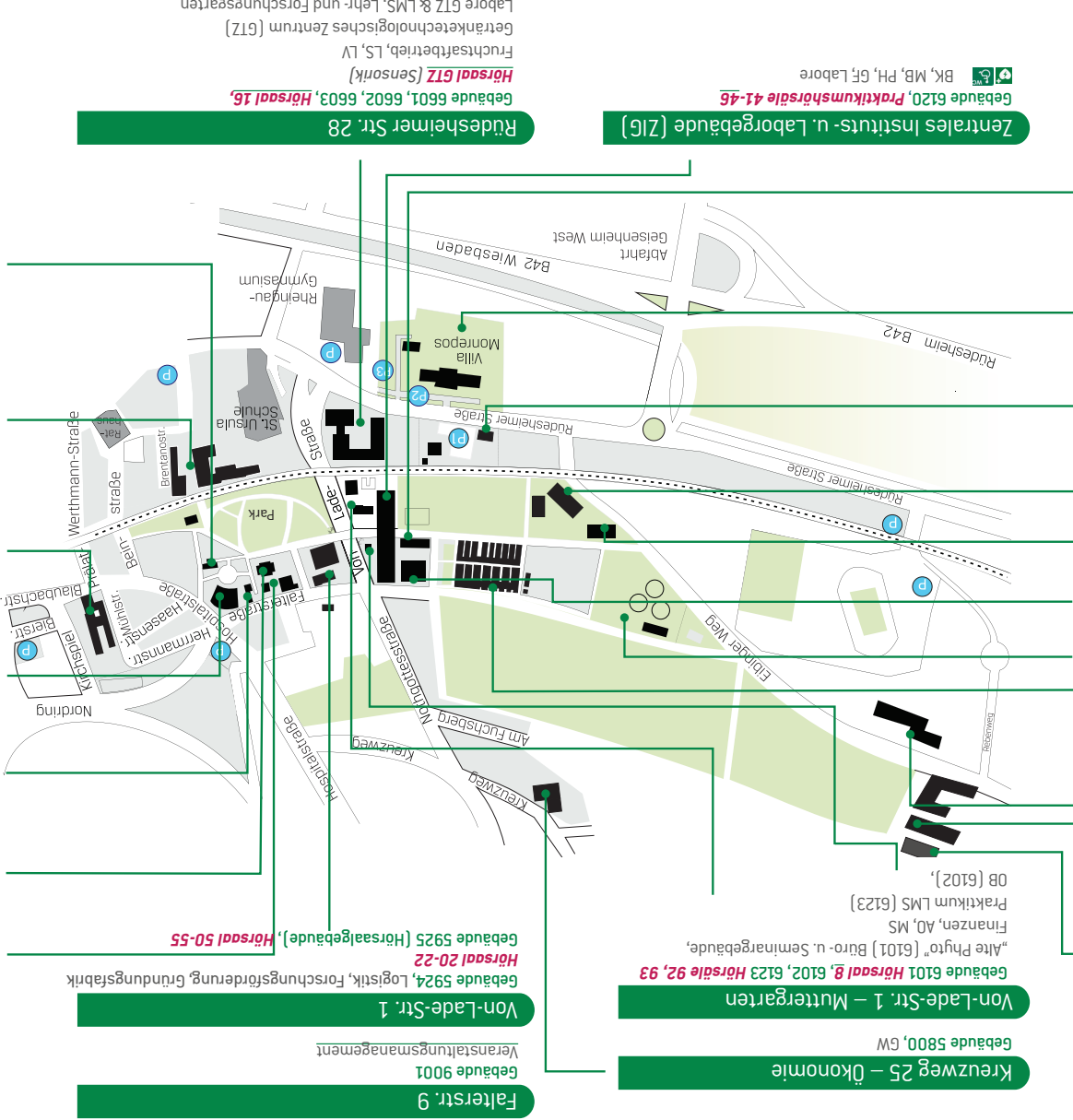

Note: Official conversion factors used in UK reporting. These factors will vary across countries depending on energy mix, transport technologies, and occupancy of public transport. Data for aviation is based on economy class.

1. Carbon dioxide equivalents (CO₂eq) Carbon dioxide is the most important greenhouse gas, but not the only one. To capture all greenhouse gas emissions, researchers express them in "carbon dioxide equivalents" (CO₂eq). This takes all greenhouse gases into account, not just CO₂. To express all greenhouse gases in carbon dioxide equivalents (CO₂eq), each one is weighted by its global warming potential (GWP) value. GWP measures the amount of warming a gas creates compared to CO₂. CO₂ is given a GWP value of one. If a gas had a GWP of 10 then one kilogram of that gas would generate ten times the warming effect as one kilogram of CO₂. Carbon dioxide equivalents are calculated for each gas by multiplying the mass of emissions of a specific greenhouse gas by its GWP factor. This warming can be stated over different timescales. To calculate CO₂eq over 100 years, we'd multiply each gas by its GWP over a 100-year timescale (GWP100). Total greenhouse gas emissions – measured in CO₂eq – are then calculated by summing each gas' CO₂eq value.
